Their contributions reiterate the transforming experience that fieldwork can offer.

which was themed *Gender Moves*, and where we celebrated our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary. On that day Willy Jansen handed out the Marjan Rens LOVA Master's Thesis Award 2019 and her speech is published in this issue as well. Participants of the LOVA International Summer School 2019 offer some reflections on their time in Amsterdam. On top of that all, we also report on the PhD Speed Date event and the panel session that LOVA co-organised in the EASA workshop *Is Gender Dangerous?*
